True Doors Project for Long-Term Care

We are thrilled to announce support for The True Doors Project at Cumberland Lodge, Glacier View Lodge and The Views at St. Joseph's. In February we received a generous donation from the Realtors at Ocean Pacific Realty, matched by Broker/Owner Dave Procter to support a True Door Project for residents at Cumberland Lodge. Building on these gifts, in honour of International Women's Day, local realtors Michele Courtney, Ronni Lister and Tracy Fogtmann generously gave to bring the True Doors project to The Views, and expand it at Glacier View Lodge.

This funding will purchase door covers that mimic a real house door for residents' rooms. The door cover might trigger fond memories of the home they grew up in, or a door similar to the home in which they raised their family, or even a favourite place they stayed on holiday. For patients with dementia, these unique door stickers will create more independence in helping them more easily identify which room is theirs, increased privacy for residents with a reduction of fellow neighbours mistakenly entering incorrect rooms, while also contributing to a neighbourhood feeling at all 3 non-profit long-term care homes in our community.



Stories told about the full life of Catherine Mary Aitken shine with vibrancy and community-spirit. Her formal name is rarely used, instead she is affectionately called Mamie. Anecdotes describe Mamie's close relationship with her sister, Cherry; her love of dancing the waltz and the foxtrot with her dear friend, John; her jelly roll fame at the Comox Valley Fall Fair (1st prize for 14 years in a row); the joy she got from sewing, cooking, golfing, and skiing at Forbidden Plateau; and her passion for the well-being of other women through her dedication to the Soroptimist International of Courtenay Club. The backdrop for all these stories is the Comox Valley, where her parents settled in 1912, where Mamie was born back in the summer of 1922, and where her legacy lives on today.
