In Our Community:

Last year, **41,243 home visits to 2,549 clients** were provided by Island Health's Professional Services Team for care such as rehabilitation, social work and case management.

Every month, **10,000+ hours of care are provided to 550+ clients** through Island Health's Community Home Support.

Thank you for offering me an opportunity to express our gratitude for donors. When COVID-19 began last spring, elective surgeries were put on hold across BC. By the time they were restarted, over two thirds of cancelled elective cases were ophthalmic surgeries. Due to the purchase of new cataract sets, we were able to expand from 12-13 cases four days per week, to 16 cases 5 days per week. This has allowed us to provide care for 700-800 additional North Island patients since the surgical expansion began six months ago. The Zeiss Callisto system integrates into our surgeries by facilitating increased accuracy and improved efficiency of intraoperative procedures which improves uncorrected post-operative vision and patient quality of life. We appreciate all the support and generosity given by donors to the Comox Valley Healthcare Foundation, you have made a direct impact on the lives of our North Island patients. Thank you.

This past year at Our Hospital:

- 7,200 visits to the Cancer Care Clinic.
- → 463 babies were born.
- 6,697 surgeries took place.
- 29,966 emergency department visits.
- \rightarrow 3,623 MRIs and 11,772 CT scans performed.

Donations over the past 3 years have funded over 60 pieces of priority medical equipment, specialized training and projects in support of our individual and collective health and wellbeing. Highlights include:

300 hours of music therapy to reduce stress of Cumberland Lodge residents with moderate to advanced Alzheimer disease, as well as supporting relaxation for residents exhibiting anxiety and depression.

The duet wheelchair tandem bike provided about 1,300 rides for residents at The Views this year. This bike with a comfortable seat for the rider and easy pedaling for the caretaker = fun, safe access to outdoor joy.

An infant resuscitation cart, jaundice meter, infant incubator and wireless fetal monitors for our youngest patients.

LUCAS Compression

System mechanical chest compression device for the ER Department ensuring good quality chest compressions, while healthcare professionals focus on patient care. Especially effective under COVID as safety protocols limit the number of doctors and nurses in a room.

A Grifold DG Spring

Centrifuge which doubled the number of lab tests performed and increased turnaround times for results.

> A recumbent **bike** for physical

189 staff took training in Basic Life Support (CPR), for fast, skilled care during a Code Blue. This program teaches: rapid assessment, CPR and defibrillation, airway obstruction, and assisted ventilation.

2 handheld Ultrasounds

for rapid and accurate diagnostics that are beneficial in assessing cardiac function.

Gel therapy mittens

worn during certain chemotherapy treatments preventing loss of fingernails.

Shockpulse Lithotripsy System for the Urology Department uses shock waves to break down stones in the kidneys, bladder, or ureter reducing the need for more invasive treatment. Patients can return home the same day of the procedure.

Cataract sets that enabled 30 extra patients to be seen each week and a Zeiss Callisto system for increased cataract surgery accuracy.

A Pedia-poser Pediatric **X-ray** for fast, gentle and secure immobilization of infants and toddlers for imaging.

Donor funded Lifts at The Views were used nearly 140,000 times.

Motivex Electronic Peddler displays scenic videos for residents with dementia at Glacier View Lodge to strengthen their bodies while custom created films play of cycling along Pt Holmes, the Airpark or up to Mt. Washington. Local scenes trigger positive memories and help participants feel part of our community.
