- Every day, 130 community
 healthcare workers provide care
 in the homes of 800 people who
 live in the Comox Valley.
- 100 residents made Glacier View Lodge their home & every day an additional 17 people attended adult day programs at the Lodge.
- 35,000 patients came into Emergency for care.
- Over 8,000 surgeries, 3,000 cataract procedures & almost 500 hip & knee replacements were provided.
- 5,000 MRIs & over 14,000 CT scans were performed.
- Our hospital lab completed over
 1.2 million tests.

"The new NeoProbe funded by donors is critical for the 300 breast cancer detection procedures performed annually. The Neoprobe can detect if the cancer has advanced into the nodes of the armpit to develop the best plan of care and surgical requirements. Surgeons can determine which nodes are affected and remove only those that are necessary, resulting in less loss for the patient and better care.
