# Tissue Processor supporting Cancer Care

The Lab at the Comox Valley Hospital, runs over one million tests each year for both inpatient and out-patient care. Lab tests are a critical part of diagnosis, informing treatment and monitoring care. To better support our hospital lab's role in cancer care detection, the Foundation is raising funds for a Tissue Processor.

The Tissue Processor processes biopsy samples collected from physicians' offices and from the hospital's operating room. These tissues are then examined by the
